Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority Partners with Team CSR Ghana to Transform Lives

On Friday, January 23, 2026, Team CSR Ghana facilitated a significant multi-sector community outreach initiative on behalf of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated, led by Executive Director Karen Williams, and supported by members of the National Pan-Hellenic Council. Through a generous donation of US\$22,000, the initiative addressed critical needs in healthcare, menstrual health, women's welfare, and access to clean water across Ghana.

As part of the initiative, Team CSR Ghana facilitated the presentation of financial support to the Maternity Ward of the 37 Military Hospital in Accra, helping secure the release of mothers who were unable to afford their medical bills after childbirth. The intervention eased the financial burden on vulnerable families and enabled the mothers to return home with their newborns.

The initiative also extended support to Street Girls Aid to strengthen its efforts in providing shelter, care, and protection for homeless girls living on the streets.

In addition, the organization facilitated support for Eco Pad to strengthen its community outreach programme by distributing reusable sanitary pads to more than 100 women, promoting menstrual health and dignity.

To advance sustainable community development, Team CSR Ghana also facilitated funding for the construction of a mechanized borehole in Awukugua, providing residents with reliable access to safe drinking water.

This impactful collaboration demonstrates how strategic partnerships can create lasting change, improving lives and strengthening communities through compassion, innovation, and collective action.





Diaspora Generosity Brings Relief to Adukrom and Frafraha communities

Team CSR Ghana began the year with another impactful humanitarian initiative by facilitating two meaningful donations that strengthened healthcare and supported vulnerable children in Ghana.

In January 2026, Team CSR Ghana partnered with Dr. Carl Bampoe and the Travel 2 Ghana Tour Group to present a donation of medical supplies and cash to the Adukrom Community Clinic in the Eastern Region. The donation was aimed at enhancing healthcare delivery by providing the clinic with essential resources needed to improve patient care and support frontline health professionals in serving the community.

Recognizing that strong communities depend on both quality healthcare and compassionate social support, the delegation also extended its generosity to the Christ Faith Foster Home at Frafraha in Accra. The home provides care, protection, and a nurturing environment for vulnerable children who rely on the support of individuals and organizations to thrive. During the visit, the team donated cash, book bags, and other school supplies to help meet the children's educational needs and encourage them to pursue their dreams with confidence.

Facilitated by Team CSR Ghana, the dual outreach reflects the organization's commitment to connecting generous partners with communities where support can make a lasting difference. By strengthening healthcare services in Adukrom and investing in the education and well-being of children at Christ Faith Foster Home, the initiative demonstrated that meaningful partnerships can transform lives and create hope for a brighter future.

Through collaborations such as these, Team CSR Ghana continues to champion sustainable community development while inspiring individuals and organizations to give back to society in ways that leave a lasting impact.





GROUND BREAKING FOR FRANKEDUA ICT LAB

Team CSR Ghana facilitated the groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of an ICT Centre at Frankadua E.P. Primary School in the Asuogyaman Constituency. The project is being sponsored by the newly enstooled Development Chief of Frankadua, Mr. Jonathan Reynolds, a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, whose commitment to the community's development continues to inspire meaningful change.

The ICT Centre is intended to provide pupils with access to digital learning resources, enhance computer literacy, and equip them with essential technological skills needed for academic success and future opportunities.

The ceremony was attended by Team CSR Ghana CEO, Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, the Assembly Member, the Headmaster of the school, the Chief of the community, and other key stakeholders. Prayers were offered for God's guidance and blessings, asking for the successful completion of the project. The initiative reflects Mr. Reynolds' dedication to giving back and exemplifies the true responsibility of a Development Chief in transforming lives through education.





Groundbreaking Ceremony Marks New Chapter for Kuntense Presby JHS

On 14 March 2026, Team CSR Ghana joined the management, staff, and students of Kuntense Presbyterian Junior High School in the Central Region for the groundbreaking ceremony of a new three-classroom JHS block. The event was attended by the Chief Executive Officer of Team CSR Ghana, Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, alongside the school's headmaster, teaching staff, students, and other stakeholders.

The project, funded by the Lambda Gamma Gamma (LGG) Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. (Capital Region Ques), Washington, D.C., USA, is designed to improve teaching and learning conditions by replacing inadequate classroom infrastructure. Prior to the intervention, both students and teachers endured challenging conditions, including a leaking roof, damaged doors and windows, and recurring security breaches. Heavy rainfall frequently disrupted lessons, making effective teaching and learning difficult.

This initiative builds on the longstanding partnership between the LGG Chapter and Team CSR Ghana, which has previously delivered a mechanized borehole, a kindergarten block, an ICT laboratory, and annual educational supplies to support the school's development.

The classroom block is scheduled to be commissioned on 8th September 2026. Once completed, it will provide a safer, more secure, and conducive learning environment for approximately 450 students, helping to improve attendance, enhance academic outcomes, and create a more supportive educational experience for future generations.





Awukugua Community Receives Safe Water as Nationwide Borehole Initiative Begins

On 8 March 2026, Team CSR Ghana proudly coordinated the commissioning of a new mechanized borehole project for the Awukugua community in the Eastern Region, providing residents with improved access to safe and reliable drinking water.

Before the intervention, community members faced challenges due to limited access to potable water, affecting sanitation, health, and daily activities. The project was made possible through the generous support of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority Incorporated, as part of its commitment to supporting sustainable community development initiatives in Ghana.

The commissioning ceremony was attended by Team CSR Ghana Chief Executive Officer Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, community leaders, school representatives, and donor representatives who joined residents to celebrate the completion of the project.

The Awukugua borehole also marks the beginning of a larger water access initiative, with 25 mechanized boreholes scheduled to be constructed across communities in Ghana. The initiative further highlights the involvement of International Women's Coordinating Council (IWCC) of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Incorporated, in advancing projects that improve the well-being of communities.

Facilitated by Team CSR Ghana, this milestone project demonstrates the power of strategic partnerships in delivering sustainable solutions, promoting healthier communities, and improving the quality of life for underserved communities across Ghana.





Safe Water Access Improved At Apatrapa Clinic Through Borehole Project

On 5 March 2026, Team CSR Ghana commissioned a new borehole facility for Apatrapa Clinic in the Ashanti Region, aimed at improving access to safe and reliable water for patients and healthcare workers.

The project, funded by the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., was initiated to address the challenges the clinic faced due to the lack of a dependable source of safe water for drinking and other essential healthcare purposes. The situation particularly affected the maternity block, where expectant mothers, newborns, and healthcare providers required consistent access to clean water.

The newly commissioned borehole will support the clinic's daily operations by providing safe drinking water and improving sanitation practices, contributing to a healthier and more supportive environment for patients and staff.

The commissioning ceremony was attended by the Chief Executive Officer of Team CSR Ghana, Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, the head nurse, nurses, a doctor, and other staff members of Apatrapa Clinic.

Through this intervention, Team CSR Ghana and its partners continue to support healthcare facilities in underserved communities by providing essential resources that improve quality healthcare delivery.

TEAM CSR GHANA MARKS ODWIRA ANNIVERSARY WITH FOURTH COMMUNITY HEALTH FAIR IN AKROPONG

In April 2026, as part of activities marking the 200th anniversary of the Odwira Festival, Team CSR Ghana, in partnership with OKWAF, organised its fourth health fair and NHIS registration exercise at the Akropong Chief's Palace in the Eastern Region.

The initiative was aimed at improving access to essential healthcare services and promoting the early detection of health conditions among residents of Okuapeman. Participants benefited from free health screenings, including blood pressure checks, blood sugar testing, and eye and ear examinations.

The programme was supported by Team CSR Ghana and the Okuapehene, Oseadeeyo Kwasi Akuffo III, as part of efforts to provide quality healthcare services and improve the wellbeing of community members.

The event was attended by the Chief Executive Officer of Team CSR Ghana, , Team CSR Ghana staff, and Madam Dede Amanor, Standard and Quality Assurance Officer of the Eastern Regional Tourism Authority. The program also received media coverage from Net 2 TV and Angel TV.

Approximately 300 people participated in the health fair, while children also enjoyed a bouncy castle activity provided during the event. The initiative reflects Team CSR Ghana's continued commitment to improving access to essential healthcare services and building healthier communities through strategic partnerships.





Women in the Diaspora Transform **Twedaase Primary School**

On April 28, 2026, Team CSR Ghana, in partnership with the Patuxent River (MD) Chapter of The Links Incorporated, commissioned a series of infrastructure and educational improvements at Twedaase Primary School in Tema. The GH¢200,000 intervention addressed critical challenges affecting the school, including inadequate access to water, sanitation concerns, and classroom conditions that disrupted effective teaching and learning.

The project delivered a mechanized borehole with a polytank, refurbished washroom facilities with new toilets, sinks, and painting, improved classroom roofing and ceilings, provided computers for the school's ICT laboratory, and donated assorted books and stationery to support pupils' learning. Appreciation parcels were also presented to all 21 teaching staff in recognition of their dedication and commitment to educating the next generation.

The commissioning ceremony was attended by Team CSR Ghana Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, staff of Team CSR Ghana, members of The Links, Incorporated, led by Dr. Cheryl Simmons Gray, the Head Teacher, staff, and pupils, who welcomed guests with vibrant cultural performances.

This impactful partnership has transformed the learning environment at Twedaase Primary School by improving access to clean water, enhancing sanitation, strengthening ICT education, and creating safer, more conducive classrooms where pupils can learn and thrive.





Empowering Girls Through Menstrual Health Education and Support

On 6 May 2026, Team CSR Ghana facilitated a menstrual health initiative at the Adabraka Polyclinic in Accra, in partnership with the Nu Lambda Sigma Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated (SGRHO) and Eco Pad to promote menstrual hygiene, dignity, and education among girls in Ghana.

As part of the initiative, reusable Eco sanitary pads were donated and distributed to over 100 girls, providing them with sustainable menstrual hygiene solutions to help address challenges associated with access to sanitary products. The program also included menstrual health education sessions designed to equip girls with essential knowledge about menstrual care, hygiene practices, and the importance of maintaining confidence and dignity throughout their menstrual cycle.

The initiative was organized in commemoration of Menstrual Hygiene Day, highlighting the need to create awareness and support solutions that prevent menstrual challenges from affecting girls' education and overall well-being.

Facilitated by Team CSR Ghana, with support from the Nu Lambda Sigma Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated and Eco Pad, the intervention reflects a shared commitment to empowering young girls through education, advocacy, and sustainable menstrual health solutions.

By combining access to reusable sanitary products with education, this partnership continues to help girls stay healthy, confident, and better prepared to pursue their educational goals without limitations

Frankadua Primary School Receives Modern IT Laboratory

Pupils of Frankadua E.P. Primary School in the Asuogyaman Constituency of the Eastern Region are set to benefit from improved digital learning following the commissioning of a modern IT laboratory on June 7, 2026.

The project was coordinated by Team CSR Ghana and funded by the newly enstooled Development Chief of Frankadua, Mr. Jonathan Kofi Reynolds, with support from members of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., reflecting his commitment to advancing education and development within the community while providing pupils with improved access to digital learning opportunities. The newly commissioned facility is equipped with two laptops and four desktop computers, providing pupils with access to practical ICT education for the first time. The commissioning ceremony was attended by the Team CSR Ghana Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, staff of Team CSR Ghana, the donor and his wife, fraternity members, traditional leaders, local officials, school authorities, pupils, and community members.

The initiative is expected to transform ICT education by equipping pupils with practical computer skills, improving their confidence, and enhancing their preparedness for national examinations while creating greater opportunities for academic and personal growth.





Mrs. Stephanie Celebrates Birthday with Street Girls Aid

To mark her birthday, Mrs. Stephanie partnered with Team CSR Ghana on June 20, 2026, to support Street Girls Aid in Achimota Abofu. The organization faced severe challenges, including a malfunctioning old freezer that caused food spoilage, and a shortage of equipment to support its skills training program.

To address these needs, the team donated a new deep freezer and sewing machines to enhance vocational training. Mrs. Stephanie also generously gifted ₵100 cash to each young woman present. The event was attended by Team CSR staff, Mrs. Stephanie, and her friend Mr. Nana Kwame.

Afterward, the excited beneficiaries danced to music to thank the team for their endless commitment. This intervention directly resolves immediate storage issues and empowers the ladies with tools for sustainable livelihoods.





Motherly Love Foundation Receives Birthday Donation

To mark her 40th birthday, Mrs. Stephany celebrated by partnering with Team CSR Ghana on June 20, 2026, to support the Motherly Love Foundation. The home, which cares for vulnerable and abandoned children living with HIV, faced a critical need for sustainable welfare support, storage infrastructure, and daily provisions.

To address these challenges, the team donated a 50-inch digital television, a 300-litre deep freezer, flour, and bags of water. Mrs. Stephany also personally gifted GHC 100 to over thirty resident children.

The event was attended by Team CSR Ghana CEO Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, Team CSR staff, donor Mrs. Stephany, foundation manager Mr. Azumah, and supporter Mr. Nana Kwame. This intervention directly resolves immediate storage and nutrition gaps, bringing immense joy and improved living conditions to the children.





Diaspora Support Enhances Healthcare Support at Somanya Polyclinic

In a continued effort to improve healthcare delivery and patient care, Team CSR Ghana facilitated a healthcare support initiative by Mr. Kofi Guy Chambers, a friend from the diaspora and newly enstooled Development Chief of the Krobo area, to equip the Somanya Polyclinic with essential medical supplies valued at GH¢15,000 (US\$2,000).

The donation, presented on 23 June 2026, included a hospital bed, privacy curtains, medical supplies drum, mobile trolley, suturing set, and Veronica bucket. These items will enable the facility to fully utilize the extension previously constructed by Mr. Chambers, which was designed to provide patients with a more private reception and treatment environment.

The presentation was attended by Mr. Jonathan Akuamoah, Chief Executive Officer of Team CSR Ghana, and staff of the Somanya Polyclinic.

As part of his continued commitment to improving healthcare services in the Krobo area, Mr. Chambers is also set to construct a mechanized borehole for the Somanya Polyclinic. The project will provide the facility with reliable access to clean water, supporting improved sanitation and enhancing healthcare delivery.

Facilitated by Team CSR Ghana, this initiative demonstrates the power of diaspora partnerships in addressing critical community needs and creating sustainable healthcare solutions.
